The following policy explanation is provided by the U.S. Center for SAFESPORT, specifically the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy.

Individual Training Sessions

The following are the policy requirements for all one-on-one In- Program individual training sessions with Minor Athletes and other, in the multi-purpose rooms.

1. **Observable:** the contact must be able to be seen by another individual (adult or minor)
2. **Interruptible:** another individual (adult or minor) must be able to stop the interaction easily.
3. **A one-on-one, in house Individual Training Session must be observable and interruptible except:**
 - A. When there is an emergency.
 - B. When there is a Dual Relationship.
 - C. Where there is a Close-in-Age Exception that applies.
 - D. If the minor athlete needs a Personal Care Assistant and all the requirements have been met for the Personal Care Assistant.
4. **The coach providing the on-on-one individual training session must get written approval from the Minor Athlete's parent/guardian before the start of the first training session and then on an annual basis afterwards. This consent can be withdrawn at any time. Copies of current consent forms must be on file with the school office.**
5. **The coach providing the individual training session must allow the parent/guardian to watch the training session.**

Note: One-on-one individual training sessions do not include individual instruction during on-ice sessions.
